Carol Richards: introduces new members and asks each of them to tell the other board members a bit about themselves.

- **Susanna Kaufmann**: Owns a software company that does molecular modeling for pharmaceutical companies. She's at TSDF because she loves children
- Lori Breslow: Worked with Diana at ERCOD for 2 years, but currently serves as Director for DHH Services at DARS. However, wants to make it clear she is on the TSDF as an individual, not as a representative of DARS.
- Oliver Meek: Works at Luminex, a company that produces medical equipment, but will retire
 later this year. His parents attended TSD and he and his wife both worked at TSD during the
 1970s when they were in college.
- Parker Kennedy: Is an alum of TSD, former TSDF board member, and former TSD diagnostician specialist. Has been working in higher education since 1998 and wants to give back to his old school

CONSENT AGENDA PROCESS

 Board Meeting Minutes: Carol explains that Jeanne Marie suggests we move towards a "Consent Agenda," meaning Carol will send the most recent board meeting minutes, via e-

mail, to all board members for review. Each board member will need to read the minutes prior to coming to the next meeting. After reviewing them, you will email Carol with any questions, concerns, suggested edits you may have, so the document can be finalized. Then, during the following board meeting, it won't be necessary to take the time to review them as a group. Carol will simply ask for a motion for approval, second, etc. Carol asks if the group would like to proceed with that method. Everyone agrees.

- **Treasurer's Report:** This same process could happen with the Treasurer's Report. However, Carol would like to continue to have the treasurer give his report during the board meetings. Her reasoning is, we have a new bookkeeper this year and we are going to be able to present you with more in depth budget information, which we think will be clearer if done in person.
- Task Forces/Committees: Taking into consideration last year's feedback that too much time was being requested of the board members, this year we will incorporate 45 minutes into 6 of our board meetings, allowing the Task Forces/Committees time to meet while already together. Of course, if you need or want to work outside of that time, you can. However, our hope is that there won't be as much pressure for you to have to do that. Also, we will allow time for each task force/committee to present what they are working on and what they've accomplished since the last meeting.

BASECAMP INSTRUCTION and OVERVIEW

Bill Huber: explains Basecamp basics: what it is, how to get started, and how TSDF will use it.

- What it is
 - Basecamp is an online collaboration (project management) tool.

How to get started

- Each board member already has or will receive an invitation to join.
- If you still haven't received your Basecamp invitation, check your spam folder. If it's not there, let Bill or Jack Busenbark know and they will resend your invitation.
- Once you receive the email invitation, you will then need to sign up by filling in your name, email and creating your own password.
- After this initial sign in, you will receive a verification notification from Basecamp.
- You will only need to complete the verification process one time.
- After that, you will simply login to gain access and see what's happening relevant to TSDF projects (i.e. task forces/committees, TSDF events, etc.)

• How TSDF plans to use it

- There are 2 ways to view TSDF projects
 - View one project at a time
 - View all projects together
- Basecamp allows you to:
 - Subscribe to every project or a specific project
 - Type info into the discussion area for all members to see
 - Send emails to others who have also signed up. (Note: emails are usually sent out from Basecamp every morning.)
 - See project notifications
 - etc.

Carol Richards: As I said, 6 of our meetings we allow time for the task forces to work. So, at 1 or 2 other meetings, we are considering having speakers on special topics. To get the conversation started, we've got some ideas, but want to know your thoughts as to a couple of topics you would like to have presentations about.

Carol initiates the conversation by suggesting the following:

- **Vision Revision:** TSDF's vision statement was not reworked when the mission statement was revised last year and that might be something to consider. However, there was no interest from the board to rework the vision statement.
- **Partners in Education:** Jeanne Marie suggests we could have a speaker from another school district to tell us about their Partners in Education program
- Legislative Updates
- Information about State Funding

Carol opens the floor to board members for their input:

- Training to "Make an Ask": Mark Seeger suggests the board receive training as to how best to pitch TSD and ask for contributions, possibly including role-playing, where two board members practice their pitch in front of the room and receive critiques from other board members.
 - Carol thinks that is a great idea and suggests it happen in January, to prepare everyone for Amplify Austin.
 - Oliver Meeks says he would appreciate training, as it would help him feel more comfortable approaching not only individuals, but also church groups, etc.
 - o **Carol** reiterates that we really want to focus on this year is getting the word out to more community organizations.
- Parent/Student/Teacher Panel: Jeanne Marie tells about a student panel she and Marilyn Galloway heard speak at a workshop for Transition Coordinators. They spoke about their challenges transitioning form school to college or school to workforce and what they felt would have helped make their transition smoother. She suggests the board might be interested in a student panel on a topic of particular interest to them.
 - Marilyn Galloway: reiterates that he student panel did a great job and it really could bring home why the board does what they do. This group does a lot of work and we could all benefit from hearing directly from the students.
 - Jeanne Marie Ellis: or possibly you could invite a few teachers to speak about minigrants: what they've funded and how teachers and students have benefitted.
 - o **Claire Bugen:** Yes, let's just allow school to get underway a bit and we can schedule a teacher/student panel.
- **Legislative Process:** Diana Poeppelmeyer suggest that next year, possibly we could have someone speak about TSDF's role in the legislative process.
 - Carol: asks, "As a foundation, we aren't really supposed to get involved in legislation, are we?"
 - Mike Moody: Confirms that is correct. As a nonprofit, TSDF can advocate for TSD, but NOT lobby.
 - Carol: suggests possibly Diana's meant for someone to give us a presentation, informing us — as a nonprofit — what was possible to do.
 - o Diana: confirms
 - o **Carol:** We can plan that topic for the fall of 2016, in preparation for the session that begins in January 2017.
 - o **Bobbie Beth:** Talks about the advantage of creating on-going relationships with our politicians, so we can educate them about TSD all the time. She suggests engaging

with them year-round, rather than just when they are in session.

Clair Bugen: shares what TSD has accomplished through Programs + Outreach with TSDF's support:

- Mini-grants
- Summer Programs
- Paddles-up
- Funding Initiatives

Mini-Grants 2014-15

- 42 mini-grants were awarded in 2014-15, totaling \$28,500
 - High school Robotics
 - Received: \$300 Mini-grant: creation of branding/logo and team t-shirt)
 - Received: \$1,000 Mini-grant: provided building supplies for robots, motors, parts for robots, and competition fees
 - Results:
 - Great self-esteem builder for kids
 - TSD students were competing with students from all hearing schools.
 Often that dissuades them, but they were very motivated
 - Many of you were concerned that the program only impacted a few students. However, it was a very positive experience for them. We believe that's how you motivate others to join and eventually grow the program

Culinary Bowl

- Received: \$1,000 Mini-grant
- Results:
 - The Culinary Bowl was a difficult competition for TSD students because they are training in a glorified home economics classroom, while the students they are competing with trained in professional kitchens.
 - We are trying to partner with Culinary Institute of America (CIA) and ACC in order to provide TSD students the opportunity to train in professional kitchens.

Art Therapy

- Received: Mini-grant last year
- Results:
 - The Art Therapy mini-grant allowed TSD students to create a beautiful mural in the CTE building, providing them with:
 - o artistic skills
 - team-building experience
 - community awareness
 - opportunity to participate in an opening event and build selfconfidence

Summer Programs

• Total Cost of TSD Summer Program: \$568,294

• Children Served: 298 students

• Cost per child: \$1,700 per child for 4 weeks

• TSDF Support: \$5,000 for scholarships, allowing 33 children to attend TSD summer programs

Paddles-Up Funds

o Family Signs

Received: \$6,600

Results: Covered costs to train 9.5 parents for 2 semesters

Robotics STEM expansion

Received: \$3,950

Results:

- Helped to start an after-school program in Elementary and Middle School
- Covered competition registration

Culinary Arts

Requested: \$11,885Received: \$3,030

 Claire: TSDF money supports a piece of a much bigger financial picture. We could spend the next five years on deciding what to fund.

o iPads

Received: \$2,900

Results:

Purchased 10 iPads for Middle School

Funding Initiatives = \$15,000

These funds were disbursed:

 - Received: \$5000 to expand High School program and initiate Middle School and Elementary School programs
 - Results:
 - This program can't be bought with a small amount
 - Additional Need
 - We need additional sponsor for Elementary robotics after-school program
 - T-shirts
 - Claire: explains there are certain things that are needed, like team tshirts, that can't be purchased with State Funds. She suggests this issue needs to be discussed in more depth with the board.

Received: \$5000

- Results:
 - Texas Academy of Audiology
 - Assessment
 - o ELF (Early Literacy Foundation) materials

General Outreach

Received: \$5000

- Results
 - Workshop: Materials for next year
 - Discovery Retreat
 - o ASL Storytelling: Equipment
 - o Family Signs: Added Instructor Hours
 - Family Signs was begun with federal funds and, due to stipulations of the grant, is only available for non-TSD families
 - There are many TSD families (El Paso, greater Austin, etc.) who don't know ASL and want to learn. We want to expand Family Signs to include them. However, we don't have the necessary funds.

Hispanic Outreach

- Received: \$26,500
- Results: TBD once best way to implement is determined
- Outcome of Focus Group and Surveys
 - Both the focus group and the survey resulted in the same priorities
 - Diana reviewed priorities and came up with two options for consideration.
- OPTION 1:
 - Family Signs: increase program = \$6,000
 - Guide by Your Side Spanish Liaison: Increase hours = \$2,000
 - Professional Training = \$2,000
 - Family Workshop Partnerships = \$4,500
 - Laredo is very interested
 - In-kind services (they already have a connection to us)
 - San Antonio Deaf Dance Troop = \$12,000
 - Their budget is \$46,000 and their school district provides half.
 - 4-week camp
 - Not enough staff
 - Diana met with Asst. Superintendent to the district and believes this could be a great partnership. A real opportunity to get involved with a program already in progress, rather than starting something new.
 - North Texas has Imagination Celebration, but it's too difficult for children from South Texas to get there. With the right focus, this could become South Texas' version!
 - o **Bobbie Beth** points out that there is a huge gap in outreach to the deaf Hispanic community in the valley. \$26,500 is only a beginning step, not a long-term solution. We need significant additional funding to have ongoing programs that will have real

- impact in the valley
- John Blazier confirms that is continuing to explore additional sources of increased funding in this area
- OPTION 2:
 - Research: David Quitos Potos, UT Professor, complete research and provide recommendation = \$15,000
 - Family signs = \$5,500
 - San Antonio Deaf Dance Troop = \$6,000
 - Jeanne Marie Ellis suggests we look into applying for a grant to get funding for research, rather than investing that much money in research.
- John Blazier: says he'd like to vote on the Hispanic Outreach options now
- Mike Moody: makes a motion for Option 1
- Marilyn Galloway: seconds the motion
- Raise hand if in favor: All but one voting member approve
- Opposed: Oliver Meek opposed
- HISPANIC OUTREACH: OPTION 1 PASSES
- Oliver Meek: prefers research when there is not a lot of money to spend
- Claire: suggests that we still may be able to engage Professor David Quitos Potos
- Mark Seeger: recommends we approach the VRS companies for additional funding. They are always looking for ways to get in front of new users and may just be willing to fund something if they could, in turn, have the opportunity to set up booths at events.

Endowment

- Fundraising through the School, TSD gifted these funds to TSDF initially
- Original Funds
 - Floerke = \$30,000 (2007–13)
 - Walkup = \$175,000 (2008)
 - \circ Eck = \$108,413 (2006–08)
 - Mortzseldt Stock = (2015)
 - Austin Trust helped attain this gift

Claire: TSD made a decision to have TSDF handle its investment. We need to create the opportunity for the endowment to continue to grow by locating more such large donor

 - O Vibes Club = \$
 - O Dominos = \$10,000
 - Architect BJK Architects
 - \$6,000 for STEM Scholarships

- Claire reminds everyone that TSD needs to fundraise \$7,500 to replace discretionary funds that used to be provided by TSDF to
 - o celebrate staff and students (Welcome back-to-school, holidays, and end-of-year

- parties, etc.)
- o academic team shirts
- Matthew Morgan deaf magician
- Claire: thanks the board and reiterates that TSD deeply appreciates all that TSDF does to support the TSD's programs and outreach. Claire suggests that TSDF revisit this area of funding as the school does not want TSDF and TSD to ask the same businesses and organizations for funding throughout the year.
- **Jeanne Marie:** suggests that before closing, everyone talk about what information stood out from TSD's presentation that they would like to circle back to and discuss later.
 - o Mark Seeger: says culinary arts needs more money
 - o Jack Busenbark: STEM needs more funding, especially for girls
 - Danny Lacey: likes everything, but there is only so much TSDF can do, so prioritizing is necessary. He is most interested in focusing on STEM + Technology and the San Antonio Dance Theater Group
 - Oliver Meek: is surprised to learn that Family Signs is needed for Austin families
 - Lori Breslow: there appears to be a lot of need in the area of Outreach. We need to increase TSDF's visibility and create more partnerships in this area
 - Jeanne Marie Ellis: wants to highlight that it isn't necessary to come up with a new list of initiatives every year
 - o Jack Busenbark: Thanks Claire, Bobbie Beth, and Diana for all they do and all they accomplished last year.

BOARD ORIENTATION

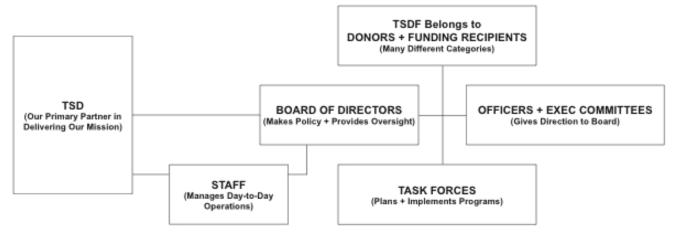
Carol: introduces Jeanne Marie Ellis to review the role of board members.

Jeanne Marie: begins by stating that boards are essential to the functioning of nonprofits. Organizations could not exist without the board guiding them.

TSDF Background:

- **Founded:** TSDF was founded in 2000 by Claire Bugen and John Blazier in order to enrich programming for the children and families served by TSD. The goal was to deepen language skills and broaden possibilities of the deaf population in Texas.
- **Status:** TSDF is a 501(c)3, nonprofit organization, governed by a volunteer board of directors, who set the direction and monitor financial and operational performance.
- Mission: 15 years later, TSDF is still dedicated to enriching programs for children's and
 families served by TSD and the statewide partners in education. Last year the mission
 statement was revised to more specifically identify what TSDF does. The new mission
 statement is to strengthen and sustain language, academic achievement and career
 pathways for deaf students at TSD and across Texas.
- How Do We Help?
 - Enhancing Educational Opportunities in five key areas:
 - Literacy
 - Outreach
 - Technology (iPads, Smart Boards, etc)
 - Career Education
 - STEM Curriculum

- o **Encouraging Creative Teaching** funding mini-grants to individual faculty + staff
- Supporting Students
 - financial awards to graduating seniors for academic excellence
 - scholarships to students in need:
 - Robotics
 - iPads
 - Summer Programs
- How is TSDF Structured?



- A nonprofit is cause driven.
 - TSDF belongs to the donors and funding recipients (students + families).
 - We need to make sure we know and communicate with our donors. What are they passionate about? How could they be engaged more?

TSDF and TSD are on the same team. The faculty and staff at TSD are 2nd to none in the nation, and we need their expertise to know how best to delivery our mission. TSD and TSDF are partners. We're married . . .we are not dating!

- What is the Board's overall job?
 - The board makes policies and provides oversight in order to ensure the mission is delivered
- What are the Board's responsibilities?
 - Determine organization's mission and purpose
 - Hire the executive director
 - Support and evaluate the executive director
 - responsibility of board chair and exec committee
 - Ensure effective planning
 - Monitor and strengthen programs and services
 - Ensure adequate financial resources
 - there is always more need than there are funds
 - Protect assets and provide financial oversight.
 - It's your responsibility as a board to understand the financials. If you don't, it's highly likely someone else doesn't either. Just let Carol know and we will work to simplify the information to make sure everyone understands this budget process
 - Build a capable board

- what skill set does it take to accomplish these things, each person asked to be here for a specific reason
- Ensure legal and ethical integrity
- o Enhance the organization's public image
 - What is our 2-minute elevator speech?
 - **ACTION ITEM:** Carol and her team can put together a 10-15 minute Power Point Presentation, so you can each have something easily accessible to help you give presentations to the public
- How do the officers guide the board?
 - Board Chair/ president:
 - runs the meeting
 - focuses on financial oversight and legal compliance
 - coordinates the work of various committees
 - assesses the work of the board and the executive director
 - O Vice Chair vice/ president:
 - steps in to carry out the chair's responsibilities in his/her absence, i.e. runs board meetings board chair cannot attend.
 - Secretary:
 - takes meeting minutes
 - ensures accuracy of board records
 - provides notice of the meetings
 - posts agenda annual meeting public might be interested in attending
 - Treasurer:
 - makes sure money is coming in and out as it is supposed to
 - Presents the annual budget to the full board of directors
- Every board member is critical to carrying out a successful mission.
 - o If you are not fully engaged and contributing, then TSDF is not what it could be.
 - You are missed when you don't attend board meetings.
 - Passive board members are not good board members
 - If you are not speaking up and participating, you are missing an opportunity to be involved and TSDF is missing out on your skills, knowledge and viewpoint
 - Remember to be courteous of each other. There are appropriate ways to express your ideas, particularly when they conflict with someone else's. Remember to think first how best to respectfully disagree. Filter your thoughts. What is he best way to say this? What good comes from making this statement right now?
 - Cooperative advancement comes from greater good goal
 - What is the best decision at this time for our foundation
- 7 Commitments to be an effective board member
 - Advocate for TSDF
 - o Give a financial gift every year. Make it meaningful and reflective of your commitment
 - Ask others to give to TSDF. (The cause leads the money follows
 - o Give your time and your talent. Each of you has special gifts. Share them. That's why you were chosen to be on this board. You're here for a reason.
 - Make connections for TSDF. Identify potential community partnerships and volunteer.
 You may have a family member, a friend, a co-worker who may be able to help and
